FIVE TYPES OF AMERICAN CITIZENSHIP STATUS

1. American State National

The foundation - naturally born on American soil or naturalized with state adoption

2. State Citizen

Self-governance participants who undertake obligations on behalf of their State

3. Federal United States Citizen

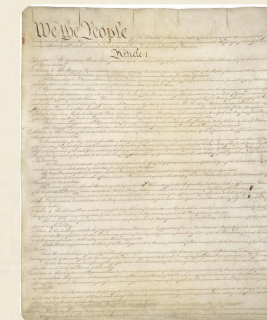
True Federal employees commissioned by the unincorporated Federation of States

4. Territorial U.S. Citizen

British Commonwealth connection - distinct from United States Citizens

5. Municipal Citizen of the United States

Federal Civil Service employees of the Municipal Corporation of Washington, DC



Each citizenship type has distinct rights, obligations, and relationships to government entities

AMERICAN STATE NATIONAL - THE FOUNDATION

DEFINITION

American State Nationals are either:

- Naturally born on the land and soil of an American State (e.g., Wisconsin)
- Foreign-born who, after being naturalized as a United States Citizen, voluntarily accepts and publishes their adoption of a specific American State as their permanent home

CHARACTERISTICS

Sovereign and private - Completely unincorporated Person

Generally immune from prosecution - Unless causing actual physical harm

Subject to Common Law - Of the County and State where they live

OBLIGATIONS

- Keep the peace
- Report crimes
- No obligations to government beyond these

STATUS

Civilian - Not acting as a citizen of any government

Internationally Protected Person - Owed The Law of Peace

Can be elected to Public Office - Becomes subject to Oath of Office during term

"State Nationals are the 'people' of each State and populate the National Soil Jurisdiction."

STATE CITIZEN - SELF-GOVERNANCE PARTICIPANTS

DEFINITION

State Citizens are State Nationals who undertake the obligations of Self-Governance in behalf of the State of the Union where they live.

ROLES & OFFICES

Jurors - Serve the Jury Pools of both Grand and Trial Juries

Public Officials - State Justices, Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Deputies

Administrative Roles - Coroners, Recorders, other Public Offices

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS

- Both State Nationals and State Citizens can take part in Public Elections
- May serve as Electors
- Members of the State Militia are all State Citizens while actively engaged
- Cannot adopt any other form of citizenship while serving as a State Citizen

AUTHORITY

Constitutional Enforcement - Can enforce Constitutions directly and indirectly

Federation Membership - Through State's membership in The United States of America

"State Citizens are the 'People' of their State and the Parties enabled to enforce the Constitutions."

FEDERAL UNITED STATES CITIZEN - TRUE FEDERAL EMPLOYEES

DEFINITION

Federal Citizens are called United States Citizens and are considered Dual Citizens while employed by the Federal Government:

- Dual Citizens of their State
- Work directly for and are commissioned by The United States of America

EMPLOYER

The United States of America - The unincorporated Federation of States

Controls:

- International Land Jurisdiction
- Non-delegated powers owed to the States in the International Jurisdiction of the Sea [Amendment X]

ROLES

Federal/Continental Marshals - Civilian peacekeeping officers

Federal Postal District Courts - Staffed by United States Citizens

Post Masters - Land jurisdiction officials

Coast Guard and Border Patrols - Technically United States Citizens

AUTHORITY

They enforce:

- The Constitutions
- United States Statutes-at-Large
- Public Laws as published on the Congressional Record

"They are all Federation Employees"

TERRITORIAL U.S. CITIZEN - BRITISH COMMONWEALTH CONNECTION

DEFINITION

Territorial United States Citizens are called **U.S. Citizens** to distinguish them from United States Citizens.

STATUS

Dual Citizens - Often of the British Commonwealth and the Municipal United States

Employer - British Territorial United States Government doing business as "the" United States of America

Jurisdiction - Work out of the District of Columbia to enforce U.S. Statutes

ROLES

- U.S. Marshals - private law enforcement officers
- Postmasters
- Members of the U.S. Military Services
- Military Dependents

Important Note

While in this status, Americans are **not Party to the Constitutions** and have **no Constitutional Guarantees**.

"Shysters like to pretend that we are voluntarily adopting this political status in order to better evade their constitutional duties and the guarantees owed to us."

These people exercise some of our delegated powers, especially within the International Jurisdiction of the Sea.

MUNICIPAL U.S. CITIZEN - FEDERAL CIVIL SERVICE

DEFINITION

Municipal Citizens of the United States are known as:

- "citizens of the United States"
- "US CITIZENS"

EMPLOYER

Municipal Corporation of Washington, DC

District of Columbia and its STATE OF STATE subsidiaries

ROLES

- Federal Civil Service members
- Officers of the Municipal Corporation
- Federal Agencies employees

AUTHORITY

Enforce global commercial law

Enforce "federal" regulations

STATUS

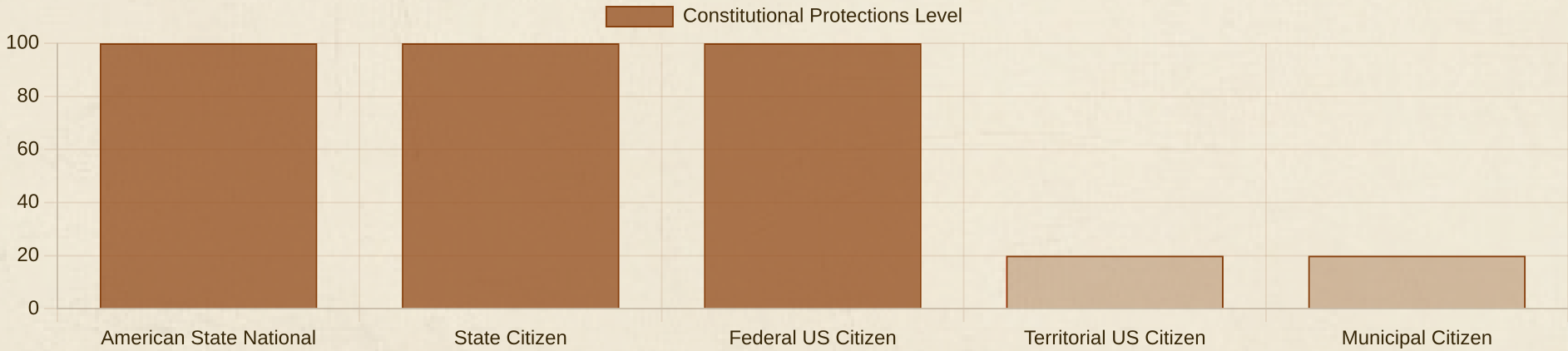
Dual Citizens - Of the Territorial United States and Municipal instrumentality

Operate under UNITED STATES CONGRESS - As an instrumentality of Washington, DC

"Shysters like to pretend that we are voluntarily adopting this political status to evade their duties to us owed under the Constitutions."

UNDERSTANDING THE DIFFERENCES

Citizenship Type	Jurisdiction	Employer/Authority	Constitutional Protections
American State National	National Soil Jurisdiction	None (Sovereign)	Full protections
State Citizen	State and County	State Government	Full protections, can enforce Constitutions
Federal United States Citizen	International Land and Sea	Federation of States	Full protections, enforces Constitutions
Territorial U.S. Citizen	International (interstate)	British Territorial US Government	No Constitutional Guarantees
Municipal Citizen of the US	Global commercial law	Municipal Corporation of Washington, DC	No Constitutional Guarantees



WHO ARE YOU? THE BOTTOM LINE

YOU ARE AN AMERICAN STATE NATIONAL IF:

You were born on the land and soil of an American State

You were naturalized and adopted a specific State as your permanent home

You have not knowingly or voluntarily adopted any other political status

YOU ARE A STATE CITIZEN IF:

You qualify as a State National

You have accepted the responsibilities of self-governance

You have recorded your political status

Key Decision Criteria

The key distinction between being a State National or State Citizen is whether you have formally accepted the responsibilities of self-governance.

Both State Nationals and State Citizens are:

- Owed all Constitutional guarantees
- Protected by the Public Law
- Free from statutory presumptions

IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS

- Most Americans are unaware that they have been misidentified as Federal Citizens
- This misidentification has led to the improper application of foreign law
- Correcting your political status is a matter of public record
- The correction process involves specific documentation and recording

"Your political status determines which law applies to you and which rights you can claim."

UNDERSTANDING YOUR STATUS MATTERS

"The rights you claim, the laws that apply to you, and your relationship with government entities all depend on your citizenship status. Understanding this distinction is crucial for exercising your full rights as an American."

Why It Matters

- Determines which laws apply to you
- Establishes your constitutional protections
- Defines your relationship with government entities
- Impacts your rights and obligations

Next Steps

- Research your current status
- Understand the documentation process
- Consider which status aligns with your values
- Take appropriate action to clarify your status

Remember: As **We the People**, understanding our citizenship status is fundamental to preserving our rights and freedoms under the Constitution.
